



7 Tips for Butterfly Photography

1) Get out early.

We've all seen those beautiful shots of dew-covered butterflies. To get those you need to be out at first light. Finding roosting butterflies can prove tough so go slow & look closely & carefully.

2) Can you reposition?

It's a cool early morning & you find a butterfly but, unfortunately, it's roosting on a boring perch and/or a drab setting. No problem! When temps make it too cold for butterflies to fly try gently coaxing them to crawl onto a stick or your finger so you can place them in a more photo-worthy spot (e.g. a flower or in a position where you can shoot through [See Tip #6]). Just please don't pick them up ~ you will inadvertently damage their wings.

3) Get parallel to the wings.

When getting close-ups of super small subjects your depth-of-field (DOF) is extremely limited. When you're positioned parallel to the wings they'll be on the same plane of focus. That assures sharpness from the tip of one wing to the tip of the other.

4) Backlight to beautify.

Butterflies are beautiful when backlit. Since their wings are semi-translucent, light will pass through & infuse them with a gorgeous glow.

5) Shoot in high speed continuous.

Once the air warms up, butterflies will begin zipping about—and quickly! Since they rarely stay still shoot in burst mode. That makes it more likely you'll get a shot of the butterfly with its wings fully spread. And take lots of shots because with butterfly photography you will have lots of misses!

6) Shoot through.

To add a dreamy quality & a nice wash of color, place flowers or foliage between you & the butterfly.

7) Get that eye sharp.

Butterfly photography is no different from any other kind of wildlife photography in that you always want to shoot for a sharp eye. When you get parallel to the wings (*See Tip #3*) the eye should automatically be sharp. If you shoot at an angle or head-on focus on the eye. Stop down to increase depth-of-field (DOF) if needed.

MEMBER SPOTLIGHT: SHARA ABEL



Shara Abel ~ Where Image Meets Imagination ~Transforming Traditional Photography into Unique Photographic Art~

I believe Art has a unique Power ~ an almost magical Power that can move us ~ a Power which helps us experience varied emotions and takes us to imaginary places ~ a Power that gives us moments in life to pause, connect and reflect with the emotional and spiritual realms of our beings. My hope is to capture, and for the viewer to experience, the essence of that Power.

Although creating & writing music has always been my major creative outlet in life, I always felt the need for something more. During my life working as a pediatric nurse and Practice Manager of a large pediatric group in Northern Virginia, I always felt like an artist inside a box. Throughout this time I dabbled in several artistic endeavors ... waiting for the magic to appear.

In 2009 God granted me some of that magic when I was unexpectedly invited to enter a photography contest with my point and shoot photo of Mt. Rainier Reflection Lake. Competing against photographers whose wonderful images were taken with "real" cameras I was completely blown away when I was later informed I won first place! This helped fuel my passion for photography and sent me on my way.

The following year I bought my first DSLR camera. Most amazing to me, people started admiring and buying my work! I was invited to join my first art gallery in Virginia and a few months later invited to put my work in a second gallery, also in Virginia.

In 2011, I finally escaped the "box", retired early and moved to Florida to help my family.

While exploring many different genres of photography, I kept finding myself "pulled" to creative editing. Longing to create something beyond the image that was before me I wanted to create pieces with a little "magic"... pieces that would evoke an emotional response in





the viewer... pieces that would make them "feel" something and maybe even have them wondering a bit. Then in 2017 I discovered "composite photography" and found my "home".

In 2018, I was extremely surprised and honored when my piece "Ghost Train" took first place in the Orlando continued Page 6

Camera Club's Annual Creative Competition as well as First Place in Creative of the Florida Camera Club Council's state competition. I was ecstatic and felt like I was heading in the right direction.

Although many of my pieces have won awards, some multiple awards, and my work has been has been shown and sold in various exhibits and galleries, as well as used commercially... I still feel very much like a new artist, with so much yet to learn.

Devoid of any real art training, I am constantly learning and experimenting as my art continues to evolve. Primarily self-taught through workshops & online classes, I graduated from the New York Institute of Photography's basic photography course in 2019.









Upon reflection, I have always been strongly drawn to composites and surrealistic art. I believe artists like Escher, Dali and Magritte, along with one of my most favorites, Thomas Cole, have a strong influence on my work.

People often ask me how I come up with and create my pieces. Sometimes I start with an idea or theme in mind, and sometimes I stare at a scary blank canvas before any ideas begin to evolve. All my

work is created using my original images and textures. I employ extensive editing, incorporating multiple layers, blending modes, techniques and versions of the piece. This involves quite a bit of time. Photoshop and Topaz are my main editing software choices.

When shooting I always keep an extra eye out for things I can use in my composites and to create textures with. My current hardware includes the Canon 5D Mark III and 7D Mark II camera bodies, along with the the Canon 24-105mm and 100-400mm lenses. I also use a Sigma 100-600mm and occasionally my Canon 50mm.

Participating as a member of various photo clubs has helped opened up the world of photography to me, as well as helped promote my growth in many ways. By joining in group events, interacting with fellow photographers, taking volunteer positions, teaching my process to other photographers, listening to knowledgeable and inspirational speakers, and learning from judges ... all this has helped this shy girl become a little more social, a little more confident and created some great friendships along the way!

A fantasy of mine is to be able to take some art classes someday. To expand my exposure to, and knowledge of, art, photography and other art mediums. My goal is to follow the plan God has for my life and to pursue refining my art. With the hope of growing participation in exhibits and galleries, as well as being able to give back, where and how I am lead.

The 2020 3rd Triannual - Digital competition is now in progress!

IMPORTANT CHANGE TO DIGITAL IMAGE SIZING.

Change to rules: Participants must reduce the size of their digital submissions to 1024 Pixels on the longest side (1 Mb maximum image size).

Reason: Members used to be required to reduce images to 4500 pixels (then the website software would reduce it further to 1024 Pixels) however due to changes by the Website Software Manufacturer, this function no longer exists and therefore members must now do this instead.





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Best Fine Art Photographer



"Master photographer Mike Jensen covers landscapes and educational classes on the artform of photography in multiple locations in America and abroad. Shooting with intent and purpose is a major part of Mike's photography philosophy. As he describes it, "To be a purposeful photographer you have to get up early a lot, and stay up late a lot and continue to go back until you get the shot you envision. You have to study the weather, the skies, the stars, the moon as well as the effect of the light on the terrain and other features."

The artwork generated by his focus and intent takes us on journeys from the Serengeti to the Midwest, the West, Florida and beyond. His emphasis is on a true-to-life color palette that's rich and brings out fine landscape details, such as flowers, sky tonal

ranges, and more. Mike's long-exposure night photography is also striking, taking advantage of the lack of light pollution in the remote areas of the US to showcase the Big Dipper, the Milky Way, and other celestial wonders normally hidden from urban dwellers."

Mike Jensen is a well-traveled photographer with over 20 years of professional experience and over 55 years clicking the shutter. Mike's specialties include night and astro-photography, breathtaking landscape vistas, astute wildlife and character revealing portraits.

Mike's passion is for learning the art that is photography and passing it on. Mike Jensen Photography Workshops teaches concepts from beginning photography, to advanced astro and light painting as well as Lightroom, Photoshop and On1. Mike also leads international photo tours.

As part of Mike's "Pay It Forward" philosophy, Mike facilitates a year-long FREE mentoring program called "The Portfolio Project". The Portfolio Project is designed to teach the participant to become a more purposeful photographer, planning their shots rather than waiting to see what comes about. Mike is well known for always being available for help whether after a class, lecture, workshop or an out of the blue email or phone call.
